SESSION/PROPERTY MEETING NIGHTS CHANGED

Our Church Session will meet on Wednesday evening, February 24, at 7:00 PM. The Property Committee will meet that same evening at 6:00 PM.

Session will meet again on Wednesday, March 2, and will then meet on the first Wednesday of each month from that date forward. Since a number of session members serve on the Property Committee, that committee will also begin meeting on the first Wednesday of each month (starting in April).

SESSION UPDATE

February 14 will be our first Sunday following Rev. Rick's retirement. As we begin this period of transition toward finding a new minister, we certainly have a number of questions.

Some of these questions were addressed on January 20, during our last Church Session meeting. Here are some highlights of that meeting:

- Kirk Allen, Liaison from the Geneva Presbytery Committee on Ministry, will serve as our Moderator during this time. Kirk will work closely with our session and serve as our guide throughout the transition period.
- Our Worship Committee has been charged with the responsibility of finding worship service leaders/speakers, using members of our own congregation or outside resources.
 The committee has already been successful in securing pulpit coverage for most of February and March. More information concerning filling the pulpit will be given during morning worship services in the upcoming weeks.
- On February 14, the Geneva Presbytery will conduct our worship service. Following the service, Moderator Kirk Allen will hold an informal question/answer meeting – many of our concerns will be addressed at that time. All are urged to attend our service and meeting on February 14.
- Our Session is committed to doing all that is necessary to effect a smooth transition and to help move us forward as a vibrant community of faith. Communication with our congregation will be a critical part of the process, and Session has pledged to do everything possible to "keep us in the loop."

IT'S PER CAPITA TIME!

Each year the church must pay a fee to our Presbytery for each member. This year that individual member fee is **\$44.00**. Our total per capita amount for 2016 is **\$5984**. These monies are used to fund outreach programs, disaster relief, the resource center for the churches, and Camp Whitman programs. In your offering envelopes box, you will find a "Per Capita" envelope. It would be great if we could all pay our individual per capita assessment and, if possible, a little more. Just ten cents a day would really help

to meet our budgeted goal. If anyone would like to start a "matching" drive/challenge, please let the Finance Committee or Session know of your willingness. Thanks for your help in balancing our budget. By the way, contributions (money, stock, etc.) can be made directly to our church's Reserve Fund.
